It is with profound sadness and shock that we received the news and followed the unfolding disaster of the sinking of the Ferry Sewol off the South Korean coast on 16 April 2014 in which many high school students were amongst the dead and missing.

It is our sincere prayer that the Korean Methodist Church, through God's grace and wisdom, will continue to be empowered to bring comfort, hope and healing to grieving families and a nation deeply traumatised by events of the past few days. As witnesses to this tragedy we are very forcefully reminded that death is woven into the very fabric of our human existence.
